The site for this planned fuxurious

house, which sits above the shoreline with views out to sea and along the shoreline, comes with a price tag in excess of £650,000 in an area where average house prices range from £750,000 to £1m.

The curving 3,000sq ft den is made up of a reception hall, shower room, master bedroom with dressing room, bathroom and study opening

onto a private balcony.

On the lower ground floor sits a proposed open-plan kitchen/reception room, bedroom hall with three further bedrooms, ensuite and bath-

The price includes parking and ownership of the cliff face and foreshore, including the beach.

Chilcott said: "This is a once in a lifetime opportunity to build a cliff top Grand Designs-style house breathtak-ingly positioned above the shoreline with staggering south easterly views out to sea and along the shoreline to Chapel Point.
